- **Corel Painter X3 software**  
Works with either Mac or PC. If you have an older version of Painter, do upgrade—it is well worth it!
- **Professional model of Wacom pen tablet**  
A Wacom tablet is a must for any digital artist. The latest Wacom pen tablets deliver the finest pen capabilities with an intuitive multi-touch surface in addition to versatile programmable ExpressKeys and Touch Rings that increase productivity. Recommend either an IntuosPro (Medium 6x8 or larger) or a Cintiq (24HD Touch) that has a screen built in. Also suggest getting the optional extra Art Pen.

# What You Need to Paint on an iPad

- **iPad or equivalent mobile device**
- **Stylus and/or brush**  
There are many choices of styluses and brushes designed to be used with the iPad. For painting I recommend a pressure-sensitive stylus like the Adonit Jot Touch.
- **Painting Apps**  
My current favorites are Sketch Club (which I used in my demonstration at the GGCS meeting), Art Rage, Brushes, Zen Brush and procreate.
